## SCHOOL WELLNESS PROGRAM- TAKING A HEALTH EDUCATION PLATFORM TO THE LEARNERS

**Pretoria, Soshanguve**- Mental health, suicide awareness, teenage pregnancy, and alcohol and substance abuse are prevalent and leading topics in our societies and high schools nowadays. The question is, do people really know whom to turn to when they are troubled or are they comfortable enough and in the right space to admit that they certainly need help, or do they just ignore the danger signs?

To answer this question and following a successful online suicide awareness that covered mental health issues in April 2022, Botshilu Private Hospital has identified a need to embark on a campaign whereby a team of mental health specialists, emergency service personnel, other health services providers, and the Rietgat SAPS will be tackling these topics through a dedicated school wellness program. The program will also include CPR and First Aid demonstration.

"The background to this program is powered by our CSI project, *#BotshiluCares*, where Botshilu intends to give back to the community of Soshanguve by creating a health education platform", explains Boitumelo Mphake, Stakeholder Relationship Manager.

The first school that we will be visiting is Soshanguve High School on Thursday, the 02<sup>nd</sup> of February 2023, targeting their matric learners. This life-changing initiative is also in partnership with Hero Burn Foundation which will promote the prevention of burns through burn awareness education and will be donating '*Soulfuel*' safe lamps that have been meticulously designed with safety in mind by Chicken Licken to help curb the increase of household burns caused by fire, especially during load shedding periods.", said Dr MJ Rampedi, CEO and Founder of Botshilu Private Hospital.
